Please arrive 5 minutes prior to your scheduled time. Teachers will have chairs set up in the hallway where you can wait for your turn. We encourage you to keep your child home if possible so you can be focused on the conference with the teacher.

## The Big Read – November 6-8

The Big Read is a reading comprehension and retention team competition. To take part in The Big Read you are required to read all of the books listed for your grade. The reading may be done independently, parents may take turns reading pages with you, or your parents may share the books with the family by reading them aloud. The intent of The Big Read program is to encourage families to read together and to enjoy reading books with your friends. The full list can be found on the school website.

As you read, you may want to journal things you want to remember and review later for the quizzing. Things to include are: author, main characters, problems that occur, unusual settings and themes.

Before quizzing begins in the fall, you must bring in the list of books along with a parent signature showing that you have read the books. You can get a list of the books from our website. Keep track of your reading. After you have read all the books, bring your signed list to your teacher.

Our school library has several copies of all of the books on the list. You will have time before quizzing to finish your reading, sign up for your team, quiz with team members, and plan your team name and costumes for the final event.

Students who have read all books on their respective list form teams that compete in a Jeopardy-style event, answering questions based on their reading list. **Each classroom teacher will decide how teams will be formed and selected.** Students may only form teams within their actual classroom. It is important after your team is formed to choose a name, practice quizzing and possibly have a team outfit. This is an optional non-graded activity; however, we encourage students to participate.
